Dr. lain ProvanMorning Speaker

Iain Provan has been the Marshall Sheppard Professor of Biblical Studies at Regent College since 1997. He received his MA at Glasgow University in Mediaeval History and Archaeology, his BA from London Bible College in Theology, and his PhD from Cambridge, His academic teaching career took him to King's College London, the University of Wales, and the University of Edinburgh, where he was a senior lecturer in Hebrew and OT.

Dr. Provan is the author of: A Biblical History of Israel (John Knox Press, 2003). Most recently he released Against the Grain: Selected Essays (Regent College Publishing, 2015), Seriously Dangerous Religion: What the Old Testament Really Says and Why It Matters (Baylor University Press, 2014) and Convenient Myths: The Axial Age, Dark Green Religion, and the World that Never Was (Baylor University Press, 2013). His next book, Discovering Genesis, is forthcoming from SPCK at the end of 2015.

Dr. Provan is an ordained minister of the Church of Scotland; a Life Member of Clare Hall, Cambridge; and the recipient of an Alexander von Humboldt Research Fellowship. He and his wife, Lynette, have four children.

Dr. Laura Robinson Harbert Evening Speaker

Laura Robinson Harbert joined Fuller Seminary in July 2014 as the dean of Chapel and Spiritual Formation. In July 2015, she also joined the School of Psychology faculty as assistant professor of clinical psychology. She came to Fuller from a 25-year career as a clinical psychologist and Presbyterian pastor.

An alumna of Fuller's School of Psychology (PhD '88), she also has an MDiv from Fuller ('86), BA from Wheaton, and was ordained in the Presbyterian Church (USA) in 1991. In addition to maintaining a private practice, Dr. Harbert has been an adjunct professor in the area of pastoral care at North Park Seminary in Chicago, Illinois, and at Fuller. She has served as a parish associate at both First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood (1993–1999) and at the First Presbyterian Church of Evanston, Illinois (1991–1993).

Harbert is especially passionate about the ways that the process of spiritual formation is a rich intersection of psychological and theological dynamics. She has long wondered about how to understand what is God's role and what is our role in the dance of being transformed into the image of Christ, and seeks to investigate the ways that we consciously want to change and grow in love, wisdom, humility, and faith, but unconsciously we resist and sabotage our spiritual growth. She asks of herself, clients, worship participants, and students, Why do we do the things we don't want to do?

Laura Harbert and her husband, Michael, also a PC(USA) pastor, have five grown children.

About WCPPC Who We Are

West Coast Presbyterian Pastors Conference is an annual week of spiritual and physical renewal in Christ for pastors. At WCPPC we simply gather each year around the centrality of Jesus Christ and His Word and renew our connection to others called by God to pastoral ministry in the Presbyterian family. We are committed to theological reflection that is deep and interactive. Our speakers are foremost theologians and practitioners.* We connect with one another in intentional small groups. For one week, we are the "company of pastors" that John Calvin designed in Geneva.


